November 2020:

During the November General Membership Meeting, we had a zoom meeting to practice social distancing safety. The meeting was extremely successful and attracted quite an attendance. We elected to get a paid Zoom account to we did not have to worry about time limits. Some of the discussions that were covered were:

- We discussed the results of the planning meeting that was held. This is provided under the October highlight.
- The Clubs Facebook page. The planning of a Facebook page for our club was presented and discussed. The discussion involved how it would be launched, what it would be used for, who has access. Three people would be the administrators and posted would have to be approved was the idea. It would be used to promote the club, events and for community outreach.
- Field mowing 2021. A discussion was brought to the meeting regarding how much was spent in 2020 and if it was feasible to continue using a contractor or members of the club to cut. When folks heard how much money was spent, there was eagerness to help our and save some money. More to come on this.
- Flight Instruction Requests. In 2020 we as a club, received quite a bit of requests for instruction. Stephen King and Tom DiCuirci are taking an interest in getting a fleet of trainers ready and setting one weekend a month for this purpose at the field. This was a discussion of ideas.
- November elections came quick this year. The two positions that were up for vote were President and Secretary. The first vote was for President. Tom DiCuirci was nominated and accepted the nomination. Shortly after, a vote was held and made it so. During this time, Tom took the time to thank Freddie Butts for his outstanding leadership as President. Freddie did great things for our club and helped a lot of things happen while in the seat. It's a tough position, but we thank him for everything he has done for us. While Tom was voted into the president position, that left the secretary position open. During this time, there was no interest I the position, but Tom had mentioned he knew someone and wanted to discuss with them about the position.
- We also took time to thank our veterans and also wish the Marine Corp a Happy Birthday during this meeting.

December 2020:

The General Membership Meeting, took advantage of the zoom meeting platform and we had a great meeting to practice social distancing safety. The meeting was extremely successful and attracted an even greater crowd. Some of the discussions that were covered were:

- We went over the planned events as a reminder for all who can help out.
- We reminded everyone about our annual Freeze Fly and the opportunity to get membership dues paid up. As always applications need to be filled out or they will not be processed. If you have questions, please let Brian know.
- The Facebook page was reported as well under way. There are three administrators, Brian Pasternak, Chris Gini and Tom DiCuirci. The team will meet and discuss final preparations for the launch.
- Field mowing: The topic was brought up about how the club will pursue field maintenance. A great discussion was held regarding what needs to be done and what can be done. The possible purchase of an additional mower was brought up and how to pay

for it.

- Tom DiCuirci addressed a letter to AMA leadership through the district requesting assistance on possible TFRs with the pending POTUS change of office. This will be developed and shared with the board and district leaders for assistance.
- FAA Final ruling. There was a huge discussion on this based on what was learned from the 400+ page document and everyone's interpretation. At first glance, we are going to be fine, status quo. The 55K comments helped paved the way for our hobby not to be hindered. The government has an understanding now of who we are and how clubs are not the threat. **Make sure you have an FAA number**, checking on TFRs and following AMA rules for flying. AMA is still working on reading and understanding the document.
 - o There are three scenarios written out for how we fit in
 - Standard remote ID. This is for Amazon and other industrial bases
 Does not apply to us
 - Broadcast Module. Small and removable device tied to your ID. Send signals about the attitude and location of your aircraft.
 - They are saying the device may be about \$20 to \$50...not sure
 - Majority of fixed wing sites. If your field is registered with AMA, then we are good! You still have to register with FAA and have it on your aircraft. AMA took the position that self-policing of the FAA requirement is what they will stand behind. Park, local and Federal enforcement will deal with offenders.

Bulk fuel order update:

The club has contacted S&W Fuel (www.s-whobby.com) about placing a bulk fuel order in March. For this to be worthwhile we will need a minimum order of 80 gallons. The fuel that we are looking at is 2% castor and 16% Synthetic both 10% and 15% nitro can be ordered. The pricing is 10% is \$21/gallon and 15% is \$23/gallon. We will be picking up the fuel order at a location that is in between S&W and Delaware, just north of Philadelphia along the blue route.
