BOARD OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSE TO THE AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT:

Last meeting, the audit committee, represented by Bob Smith gave their report and a list of suggested changes in the way that we operate.

The Board of Directors met to respond to these suggestions.

→ Suggestion: All events CD's will be required to fill out a detailed accounting of club money spent. (suggest club membership come up with some kind of form or the club issue a ledger book to be filled out and returned at the end of the event) **Response:** The Club and all other known events have been operated on an informal cash basis and the CD has better things to do than keeping a ledger. We trust the members of the club to be honest in their handling of incoming money. Those who have expenses related to the operation can submit receipts for reimbursement.

→ **Suggestion:** A cash box is started containing \$100. Cash will be disbursed only with Cash Distribution Form filled out by requestor. Petty cash limit is \$50 otherwise a check shall be issued by the club Treasurer.

Response: Don't need it. Pay from your pocket, submit receipt and get a check from an executive.

Suggestion: In the absence of the club Treasurer at general membership meetings the club President will present the club Treasurer's report monthly.

Response: Already being done; but see By-Law changes below.

Suggestion: Signatories on bank account are not up to date.

Response: Will be straightened out – club officers will be signatories.

Suggestion: The outgoing Treasurer will notify and furnish to the Delaware R/C's bank; the name, phone number and email address of the incoming Treasurer.

Response: OK.

CHANGES TO BYLAWS

Should be published at least 5 days before meeting; can vote next month.

ARTICLE 5 – DUTIES

Treasurer: The Treasurer shall collect all moneys due and shall keep a record of moneys disbursed by the Club *and present a monthly report to the general membership meeting.* He/she, or a person designated by the President, will be the Club's contact person with AMA.

ARTICLE 6 - AUDIT

The Board of Directors shall appoint an Audit Committee consisting of a minimum of one Board member who does not have check-signing authority and 2 Club Members at large to perform *a biennial audit of the Treasurer's books and the Club property*,

coinciding with the treasurer's election cycle.

ARTICLE 9 - COMMITTEES

The committees of the Club shall be established by the President and may be approved by a simple majority vote of the members present at a meeting (if a vote is requested), to serve throughout the term, or less, of his/her tenure of office. Standing Committees are the Safety Committee, Membership Committee and the Field Maintenance Committee. *The membership chairman shall collect dues and remit them to the treasurer.*

FROM THE SECRETARY:

It is my intention to reinstate the club meeting minutes in the newsletter. The minutes will not be an extensive and detailed listing of all the discussions and activities. This is intended to list the majority of the discussion points and activities. I would encourage each of you to attend the club meeting to be part of the discussion and decision-making.

WHAT I'M DOING THIS WINTER - by Roger McClurg

The weather has been terrible for flying, but great for building. I bought a Balsa USA 1/6 scale Sopwith Pup kit for my winter project. I didn't start it till last month, but have made considerable progress. Most of the basic construction is done. The Pup looks like it is ready for covering. The only outward construction that needs to be done is to add wood to hide the metal landing gear and cabane struts, and finish building the outboard struts. Then the fiddly bit starts.





I plan to install pull-pull cables on both elevator halves and on the rudder. The wires have to be routed with no binding, and the servos installed. The aileron servos will be mounted into the underside of the bottom wings with flush covers so only the servo horn is exposed. The ailerons will use a standard pushrod setup. Pull-pull ailerons would really look great, but I don't have that much ambition. I'd love to build a complete scale cockpit, but there isn't enough room. A scale British pilot and instrument panel is about the best I can hope for. The Vickers machine gun is assembled, and a scale windshield attached. On the Pup the windshield is a tiny thing that mounts to the back of the machine gun. It sure looks strange. The last steps will be to cover the model and install cockpit combing around the cockpit and the windshield, and, of course, attach all the rigging wires. All of the above will most likely take as long as it took to get to this point. It's the 80/20 rule. The first 80% of the job takes 20% of the time. It's the last 20% that takes 80% of the time.

Here are some construction photos. The parts are bolted, taped, and pinned together to give you an idea of how it would look. Also included is a shot of a really nice 1/3 scale Pup from WOD 2014 so you can see the look I'm going after.
